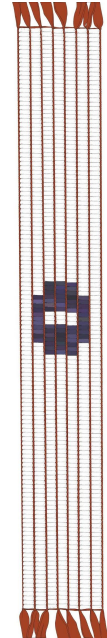

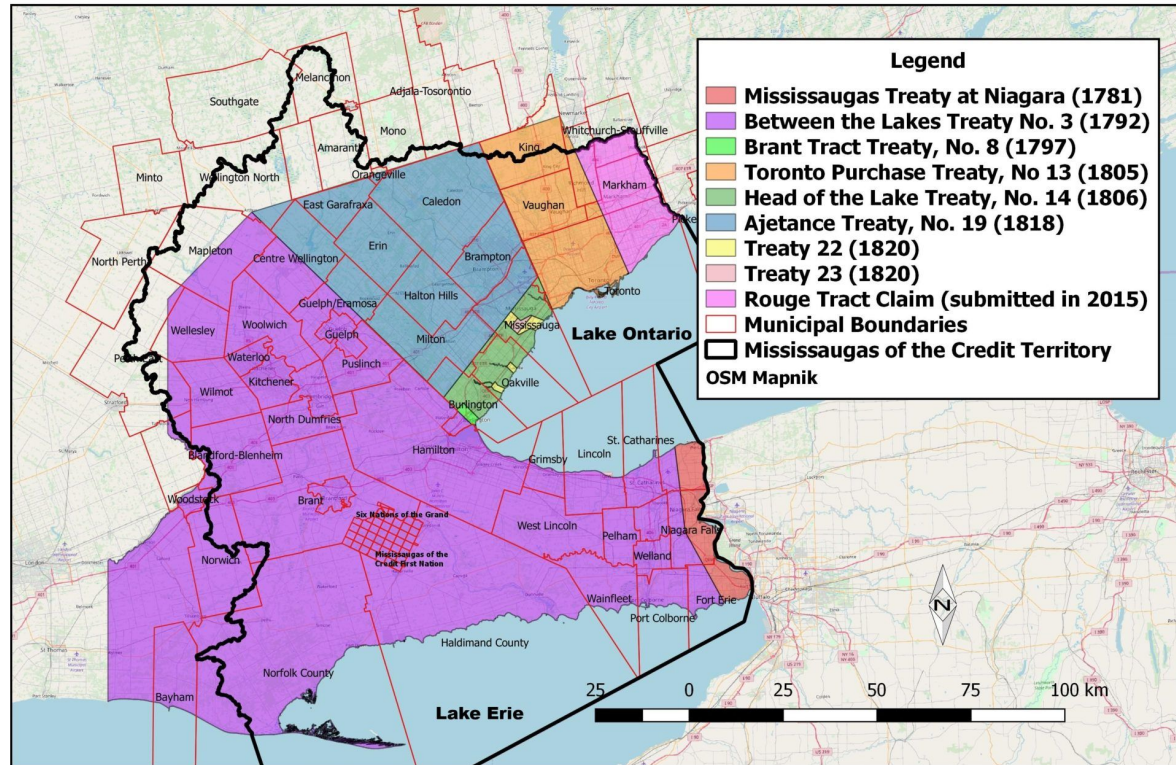

Role of City Councillor

- Responsibilities under the **Municipal Act** apply to Councils and how they make decisions on behalf of residents at large (not just in wards)
- Councillors are held to a **Council Code of Conduct**

Role of City Councillor

- “It is the role of Council”
 - (a) to represent the public and to consider the well-being and interests of the municipality
 - (b) to develop and evaluate the policies and programs of the municipality;
 - (c) to determine which services the municipality provides;

Role of City Councillor

- “It is the role of Council”
 - (d) to ensure that administrative policies, practices and procedures and controllership policies, practices and procedures are in place to implement the decisions of council;
 - (1) to ensure the accountability and transparency of the operations of the municipality, including the activities of the senior management of the municipality;
 - (e) to maintain the financial integrity of the municipality

Role of Chief of Police

- Responsibilities under the **Community Safety and Policing Act** in effect as of April 1, 2024
- Charged with ensuring “adequate and effective policing”

Community safety and crime

- Violence
 - physical and verbal assault
 - intimidation
- Theft
- Vandalism
- Lack of police presence

Community safety and crime

- “Adequate and effective policing”
 1. Crime prevention
 2. Law enforcement
 3. Maintaining the public peace
 4. Emergency response
 5. Assistance to victims of crime

Business Improvement Areas - BIAs

- Role of a BIA to support and advocate
 - Example - Delegation to the police board
- Costs and responsibilities for property and business owners
- Currently discussions around the potential of more BIAs in Ward 2

Pedestrian and bike safety

- **Bike and foot traffic** - Researchers found that customers who arrive by bike spend 24% more per month than those who arrive by car (with the exception of supermarkets)
- **Protected bike lanes increase retail sales** - in New York, after the construction of a protected bike lane on 9th Avenue, local businesses saw a 49 percent increase in retail sales, while local businesses throughout Manhattan only saw a 3 percent increase in retail sales

Pedestrian and bike safety

- **Helping businesses to thrive** - Designing your business to meet the needs of the people who live close by is the single best thing you can do to help your business thrive - a majority arrive to main streets by walking, cycling, and transit
- **Density in Ward 2** - Downtown Hamilton is a very dense place when compared to the rest of the city -
 - Single family home density 11.5% in Ward 2 vs 40.4% in Ward 1
 - Apartments of 5 storeys or more 61.2% in Ward 2 vs. 28.8% in Ward 1
 - Ward 7 has the same number of households but is 3x the size of Ward 2

Grants and City programs

- **Commercial District Revitalization - \$ varies - Matching - BIA**
 - Exterior and some interior improvements to enhance the appearance, accessibility, and environmental sustainability (including graffiti)
- **Commercial Vacancy Assistance - up to \$10,000 - Matching**
 - Interior improvements for new permanent or pop up commercial tenants for existing vacant spaces

Grants and City programs

- **Commercial District Housing Opportunities - up to \$600,000**
 - Creation and improvement of housing units in commercial spaces (includes low interest loans)
- **Downtown Hamilton Office Conversion - \$ varies - CBD**
 - Feasibility studies and construction projects aimed at converting former office spaces into a residential or hotel unit within the CBD (Central Business District)

Grants and City programs

- **Start-Up and Office Tenant Attraction - \$ varies**
 - Leasehold improvements for new and existing office spaces (loans with some partial forgiveness)
- **Revitalizing Hamilton Tax Increment - \$ varies**
 - Incentivizing property improvements in commercial districts (over four years); these are most commonly applied for by those developing property

Grants and City programs

- **Hamilton Downtown Public Art Reserve - \$ varies**
 - Improve the quality of public space and animate street life in the downtown core
- **Heritage Grants - \$ varies**
 - Conservation and restoration of heritage features on existing commercial buildings (grants and loans)

Grants and City programs

- **Improved - Litter on Streets, Sidewalks, and in Bike Lanes**
 - 5 days per week; we've procured three EV mini sweepers; new Downtown Hamilton Clean Team pilot
- **New - Bridge and Underpass cleaning**
 - Power washing and flushing occurs on a weekly basis (winter weather dependent); pigeon netting installed

Grants and City programs

- **New - Graffiti Removal on Public and Private Property**
 - Annual graffiti blitzes and improved way for Ward 2 office and BIAs to submit graffiti complaints; active focus on 27 “hot spots” downtown on public property (30 day cycles); graffiti prevention on hydro and traffic signal boxes (new wraps to deter graffiti and make it easier to clean)

Motions put forward this term

- **Subsidized and expanded patio program**
- **Art installations and events** - Lights on King William
- **Pedestrianization** - James Street North, King William Street, Gore Park
- **Street safety** - bike lanes to connect key commercial areas, pedestrian crossings and intersection pedestrian signals, road resurfacing (King Street, Main Street, James Street)
- **Sidewalk improvements**
- **Litter, graffiti, and underpass cleaning**

Motions put forward this term

- **Feasibility of a pilot for a “Hamilton Community Crisis Service”**
- **Community Grants** - including for not for profit institutions like YWCA, YMCA, AGH, and Theatre Aquarius
- **The Music Hall** - 24 Main Street East
- **Creation of new BIAs** - Hess Village, James Street North (?)
- **New Greenspace and Playspace** - Beasley Park expansion, misting stations
- **Additional drinking water fountains and garbage cans**
